





NORTH ELEVATION




SOUTH ELEVATION




EAST ELEVATION



SITE PLAN WITH FIRST FLOOR





SECOND FLOOR





LONGITUDINAL SECTION




CROSS SECTIONS

Richard Neutra Case Study Project

In the mountains of southern Switzerland near Lake Maggiore, two thousand feet above the town in which it sits, is a house in a town called Nareggia. The Bucerius house, in order to reflect the isolated swimming village that it is, has been built through the mountain forest along a mile long winding road, which crosses a rushing rocky stream. Looking out on the wide south and east terraces is a stunning view of Lake Maggiore surrounded by towering magnolia trees and suntrap caravans. The wide shallow pools surrounding the terraces reflects the clouds in the sky, day or night, the moonlit treelops and mountains by night. Neutra placed several windows along the south and east sides to take advantage of the wonderful view of the site.

The upper floor quarters the servants with three rooms, a bath and a toilet, and two separate terraces. The middle floor is designed for the residents. On this level is the garage, the main entrance, and rooms of a typical house such as the master bedroom, kitchen, living room, dining room and a library. The lower floor is mainly for visitors. This floor contains guests with three rooms, two baths, a luggage room, etc. For the winter there is an indoor garden and part of the pool can be shielded from the exterior to form an indoor pool.
